### Candidate Statement for David Simmons:

My name is David Simmons, and I'm running to serve on the AFT-W executive board as Vice President for the Eastern Region. I currently serve in this position, and as chair of the Department of Philosophy & Religious Studies at UW-Whitewater, where we formed an at-large local, UW Whitewater United, in the spring of 2020. As the chair of the Faculty Senate from 2018-2020 and a member of the AAUP, I am a strong believer in shared governance, in which faculty and other governance groups become decision makers with the Chancellor, Provost, and other administrators, based on the principle of the labor movement that the best decisions are made when workers and managers collaborate. As Faculty Senate chair I worked with shared governance leaders from all over the University of Wisconsin System, including university staff represented by AFSCME. As an employee of the Evanston Public Library, my mother-in-law joined AFSCME and organized the municipal workers in Evanston. But my education in the labor movement began much earlier. Since I began my career at UW-Whitewater in 2006, my teaching and service have been informed by values I learned from my mother, a middle school teacher, and father, a professor at the community college in my hometown. Labor organizing has always been a "kitchen table" issue for me. My mother negotiated contracts for her teachers' union, and among her union sisters was Becky Pringle, my middle school physics and chemistry teacher who is now president of the NEA.

As Faculty Senate chair, I visited many campuses in the UW System, including UW–Parkside and UW–Milwaukee. I am familiar with UW System politics at the highest levels among the Board of Regents and UWSA, and have worked with shared governance leaders at every campus in the System, including campuses that have strong AFT-W locals. I have a good sense of the different needs of the various locals and campuses in our region, and I am a fierce advocate of both faculty governance and the right of all workers to self-determination and negotiation in their workplace and compensation. As a faculty governance leader, I worked to ensure that faculty had a say in the administration of their university. As a member of AFT–W, I will continue to work to ensure the members of the Eastern Region are afforded their rights to a safe, healthy, and equitable workplace as well as fair compensation for the value they bring to Wisconsin.
